THE ROLE OF FAITH LEADERS & HOUSES OF WORSHIP IN KEEPING OUR COMMUNITIES SAFE FROM CLIMATE IMPACTS

Faith leaders can connect climate adaptation to shared faith values and invite their communities to take practical steps together. They can use places of worship as shelters during heatwaves or storms, share clear guidance on preparing for floods and extreme weather, and organize neighbors to respond collectively. They also provide emotional and spiritual support, advocate for the most vulnerable, and help communities find meaning and resilience in the face of climate crisis. Through education, collaboration, and care, faith leaders are vital in building hope, trust, and action during times of environmental emergency.
